With an adoption fee of just \$20.00, many families were able to give a pet a new home and a new life. All animals were spayed/neutered, microchipped, and up to date on vaccinations.

SPCA Florida partnered with Polk County Animal Control and Humane Society of Polk County to bring Polk County's homeless animals together for this event. Animals were available for adoption at each shelter.

"We are thrilled with the outpour of support from our community," said Shelley Thayer, SPCA Florida, Executive Director. "Temperature checks, masks, and safe-distancing were the norm at shelters where 216 animals found homes on Saturday.
