The adoption fee is just \$20.00! All animals will be spayed/neutered, microchipped, and up to date on vaccinations.

SPCA Florida has partnered with Polk County Animal Control and Humane Society of Polk County to bring Polk County's homeless animals together for this event. Animals will be available for adoption at each shelter.
