SPCA Florida Receives \$30,000 Petco Foundation Lifesaving Grant

Lakeland, FL — SPCA Florida received a \$30,000 grant from the Petco Foundation for kennel doors. The Petco Foundation has been a community supporter of SPCA Florida, providing funding and community collaboration opportunities for many years.

The Petco Foundation investment will help purchase BiteGuard pet doors for the kennels to improve the quality of canine life. Large dogs will be able to move freely between the inside and outside portion of their kennels without releasing cool air from the inside, out. The ability to go in and out as the dogs please alleviates stress, helps them interact with adopters, and minimizes the spread of airborne diseases. An inviting environment will be welcomed by potential adopters, but as well for staff and volunteers.

“This was a huge win for our large dog population,” said Shelley Thayer, Executive Director of SPCA Florida. “The addition of a simple door will benefit our dogs’ mental and physical well-being during their stay with us. We are grateful to the Petco Foundation for enriching their lives.”
