Lakeland, FL—SPCA Florida's Annual Critter Camp will be held this summer with camps in June and July. Critter Camp is open to children from grades 4 to 7 and is offered at the SPCA Florida Campus located at 5850 Brannen Road South.

Camp weeks will be filled with crafts, games, and service projects that are designed to educate and inspire our youth to practice a lifestyle of compassion, respect, and responsibility through the humane treatment of animals.

Critter Camp is \$250 per camper for the entire week. Camp weeks are:

June 15th -19th and July 13th - 17th
Available to rising 4th and 5th grade campers

June 22nd - 26th and July 20th - 24th
Available to rising 6th and 7th grade campers

For best practices during COVID-19, we are limiting sessions to 8 kids campers week, and performing temperature checks every morning. Children must bring a mask and hand sanitizer and hand washing will take place throughout the day. Teachers will also wear masks.
